## Articles of Half Term:

 **Writing:** Our book for this half is 'Leaf' by Sandra Dieckmann, it's a beautiful story about a polar bear who is away from home and is trying to get back to his own environment. We will be focusing on descriptive language to bring our writing to life. We will also be writing a recount piece all about our trip to the STEM centre at Gatwick!


 **Phonics:** We are continuing to work hard following the Read Write Inc phonics scheme. Each child will have individual targets depending on the group that they are working within, please ensure you are continuing to read at home daily with your child as this has a huge impact on their phonics and reading!


 **Maths:** We have started this half term by looking at mass, capacity and temperature. As we continue to learn we will be moving on to fractions and time.


 **Science:** This half term our topic is Plants. We will be exploring the differences between a seed and a bulb, the life cycle of a plant as well as how plants can adapt to their environment. We will design an experiment to test what a plant needs to grow and be healthy.


 **History/Geography:** This half term we are carrying on with geography and continuing our focus on where we live. We are going to focus on Gatwick airport and the significant impact this has on Crawley. We will be learning about the different jobs available at Gatwick, learning more about this through our trip to the STEM centre, as well as debating the pros and cons of another runway at Gatwick.


 **Music:** This half-term, the children in Fern and Ivy will be learning about structure – how a piece of music is organised and built in sections, a bit like a story with a beginning, middle and end. The well-loved story We're Going on a Bear Hunt will be a source of inspiration to collect different rhythm phrases such as Stumble-Trip and Hoo Woo, which will then be ordered and placed into the children's own musical structures that they will perform with percussion instruments.


 **PSHE:** This half term we will be looking at the different jobs that people do, how different skills can be used in a variety of job roles and how the internet can be an integral part of jobs when being used safely. Children will learn where money comes from and explore how money can be spent on different wants and needs.

 **Computing:** In this unit, we will be exploring effective searching. This will help us gain a better understanding of how to search safely and effectively on the internet.

 **PE:** In outdoor PE we will be focusing on striking and fielding skills to prepare us with the skills needed to play sports like cricket or rounders. In indoor PE we are focusing on team building skills, essential knowledge when playing with others across a variety of sports.

 **Gospel:** This half-term, we will be working on two questions. How do some people talk to God? What do candles mean to people?

 **Art & DT:** We will be focusing on DT this half term and looking closely at mechanisms to help us to build a moving vehicle! Our vehicles will be based off of different vehicles used in Gatwick airport, linking in to our over arching topic 'What if we could fly?'

 **Forest Schools:** This half term, Bracken class will be searching for and identifying minibeasts in both a woodland and a pond habitat. They will also be making art from natural resources, learning the names of common trees and cooking pancakes on an open fire.
