Online presence

From an early age, work with your child online, accessing content together and discussing tracking features, such as cookies. If your child has an understanding at an early age that their interactions in the digital world are recorded, they are far more likely to develop a careful approach. As a start, you could search your own name on the internet with your child to see what your digital footprint contains. Discuss how the information got there and if there is anything that you are unhappy about. Use this activity to stress the importance of asking for permission before sharing anything online, including asking your advice about names to use if playing online games.
