## PASSPORTS TO LEARNING

In order to make the activities count, it is essential that your son/daughter's Passport to Learning is completed regularly and handed in to Miss Laughton on the assigned collection dates (these are posted on Twitter, our newsletters and a ParentMail will be sent to inform you of the date each half term).

Each activity your son/daughter does should be entered into their Passports to Learning. See the example below.

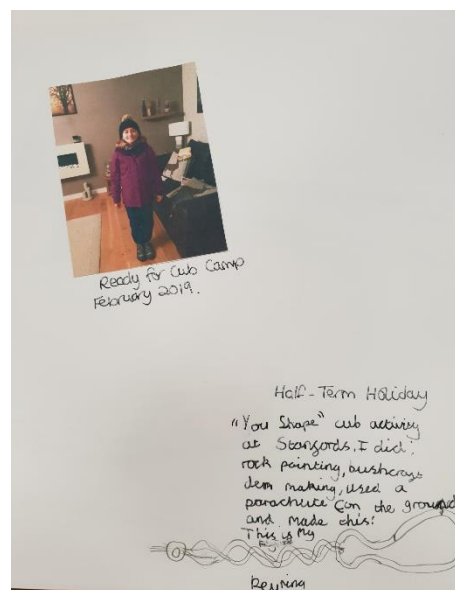
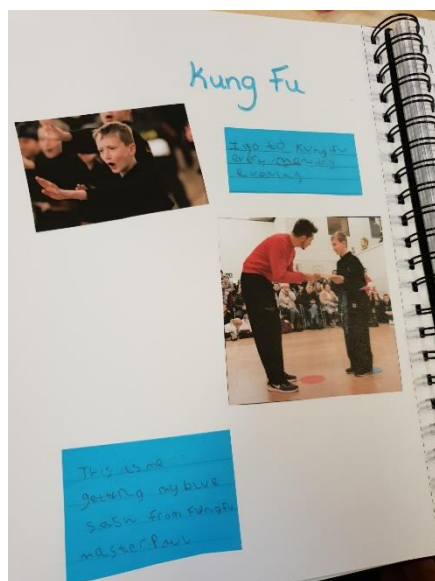
Date	Hours	Activity	Stamp/Signature

Please note that some activities only earn a certain amount of credits no matter how many hours are spent on them e.g. Cub Camp would earn 5 credits and only 6 credits per club per half term can be earned, even if the club lasts 2 hours at a time.

These rules have been set by the Children's University.

## SCRAPBOOKS

In order to keep up to date with the activities that your children are doing, they will be asked to keep a scrapbook alongside their Passport to Learning. In the scrapbook, the children should show photographs, copies of certificates, writing etc. to do with their completed activities. They should also add a small comment about what they have done and learned from the activity.
